

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT:

As an organization, we are doing everything we can to bring back our camps to serve our community and we need your help to ensure a safe, healthy and amazing experience for all involved. Our collective goal, as a camp family, is to host our camps annually and we are asking for your support, in the form of being vaccinated, to keep those we serve as safe as possible.

At RAD Camp, we are requiring <u>ALL participants</u> to be fully vaccinated according to CDC guidelines. All participants are required to provide proof of vaccination upon registering. To be considered for an exemption, please contact <u>Wellness@RADCamp.org</u>. Additional measures will be required for participants that are not vaccinated (see page 4).

Ultimately, it is your decision as to whether now is the right time for you or your loved one to attend summer camp and we support your decision. If you choose to not return this summer, your spot will still be available in 2023. Thank you for your understanding and thanks for being RAD!

- 1. Vaccination Policy Please see page 1.
 - a. **Campers**: Campers will need to be <u>vaccinated unless they</u> <u>have a medical exemption</u>. See page 4 for more information.
 - b. Volunteers: Volunteers will need to be vaccinated.
 - c. Medical Staff: Our medical team will need to be <u>vaccinated.</u>
 - d. Camp Angels: Camp Angels will need to be vaccinated.
- New Age Requirement RAD Mini will now serve <u>campers ages</u> <u>5 and older</u> so all campers have the opportunity to receive the vaccine.
- 3. Daily Medical Check At the start of each day, all participants will participate in a daily medical check including a <u>questionnaire and temperature check</u>.
- 4. Masks Following current state guidelines, <u>masks are optional</u> for participants, regardless of vaccination status, in indoor and outdoor settings at camp. RAD's Medical Staff/Team will need to wear masks at camp.
- 5. Testing
 - a. At Check In: All participants will be <u>tested upon arriving</u> <u>to camp regardless of vaccination status.</u>
 - b. During Summer Camp: All participants may be <u>tested in</u> <u>the middle of the week</u>.

a. Medical Staff: Our medical team will be tested daily.

- 6. Limiting Exposure
 - a. Eating: Participants will eat meals and snacks outdoors.
 - a. Sleeping Arrangements: Dorm rooms will be limited to <u>four people per room</u> and have their own bathroom to help limit exposure.
 - b. Activity Supplies: Similar to the RAD Remote Program, campers will <u>receive their own program supplies</u> at check in to assist with limiting exposure.
 - c. Sanitation: Vanguard University's janitorial team will <u>clean</u> <u>and disinfect surfaces and spaces on a routine schedule</u>. RAD volunteer program staff will also receive <u>sanitation</u> <u>kits</u> to clean surfaces and supplies in their classrooms.
- 7. Positive Cases (Note: It has always been RAD Camp's policy to send participants home if they are sick. Participants are not able to return to camp without a signed doctor's note stating they are cleared to return to camp and participate in activities. The same policy will apply for positive COVID cases at camp.)
 - a. Testing Positive: If a participant tests positive for COVID while at camp, they will <u>quarantine in a designated area</u> <u>until a parent/guardian can pick them up</u>.



- a. Pairings/Partners: If a participant's partner tests positive, the <u>participant will quarantine and be tested</u>. The test, as well as the degree of symptoms or lack thereof, will determine if the participant is able to remain at camp or will need to be picked up.
- b. Close Contacts: At camp, <u>dormmates are considered</u> <u>close contacts</u> since they share an overnight space (see Page 3, #6 Limiting Exposure). If a participant tests positive, <u>close contacts will quarantine in a designated</u> <u>area and be tested</u>. The test, as well as the degree of symptoms or lack thereof, will determine if the participant is able to remain at camp or will need to be picked up. For minors and dependents, parents/guardians will be notified of close contact exposure.

Requirements for Participants with Medical Exemptions

- Letter A signed letter from a licensed physician noting your medical exemption is required to participate. The letter will need to be uploaded to your Campwise profile.
- 2. COVID Test <u>Results from a COVID-19 test taken within 48</u> <u>hours of arriving to camp</u> is required. The test results will need to be uploaded to your Campwise profile. The participant will then be tested again upon arrival with all other participants.
