

Camper Agreement

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Participation in RAD Camp or RAD Jr. is a privilege we hope our campers enjoy. For the welfare of campers, as well as the entire camp community, it is essential that parent/guardians read, explain to their camper, and understand and agree to support the provisions of this agreement.

Along with parent/guardian support, Campers will uphold the following conduct:

- Show respect for all campers, volunteers, staff, and the camp community
- Refrain from profanity or indecent language
- Refrain from the use of cell phones, computers, iPads (unless used as a communication device), etc., except when allowed by the Directors
- Respect the personal property of campers, camp facilities, counselors, and Staff as well as the camp venue
- Cooperate with the Directors, Nurses, Team Leaders, other Staff
- Remain on campgrounds unless special permission was received from the Directors to leave for some serious and necessary reason
- Refrain from physically touching, hitting, biting, or hurting fellow campers and counselors, and understand if something like this does happen, a warning will be given and then possibly asked to leave camp based on the decision by the Directors



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- Upon arrival, check in immediately with a Nurse. If camper's vitals show any sign of concern, they will be asked to leave camp and will only be allowed to return with doctor's authorization
- Notify the Directors of any major changes, updates, or surgeries that take place in the months leading up to camp that were not present during registration
- Any symptoms of a cold or flu within 48 hours prior to camp will be reported immediately by telephone call to the Directors to discuss camper's attendance at camp
- If unable to stay at camp for any reason (illness, behavior, emergency, etc), a parent/guardian or an approved contact must be available to pick me from camp within two hours
- Camper's parent/guardian must have a local contact (family, group home, care assistant, etc) available that is on-call for the duration of camp and is fully equipped to assume full care (including transportation) should anything arise
- Camper's need to sleep at night and be mindful of physical wellbeing. If the camper should start to feel as though they need a break from activities or a nap, all they need to do is ask their counselor/team leader

Parents/guardians and campers attending a RAD Camp program must agree to the provisions of the Camper Agreement as stated above. They understand that if their camper violates any of the provisions of this agreement they are subject to dismissal. RAD Camp reserves the right to re-invite campers back each year based on their behavior at camp by way of evaluations and compliance with the Camper Agreement.
